Dear friends of Holy Cross Seminary,

A few years ago I read the following reflection on the Resurrection:

"The death of Jesus was not the end of his power and presence, for he was raised up by the power of God. Nor did it mark the end of the disciples' union with him. After Jesus had appeared to them, and when they received the gift of the Spirit, they became apostles of the good news to the ends of the earth. In the face of poverty and persecution they transformed lives and formed communities which became signs of the power and presence of God. 
Welcome - New Staff for 2024

FR THANH TRAN (Human Formator)

Fr Thanh Tran was born and raised in a Catholic village in Vietnam. After completing high school, he moved to Saigon for university, later coming to New Zealand to pursue the Priesthood. Upon his arrival he spent time learning English and getting familiar with the culture in Christchurch before coming to Auckland to study Philosophy and Theology at Holy Cross Seminary and Good Shepherd College. Following his ordination, he returned to his incardinated Diocese of Christchurch to serve as a Priest. We are grateful to have Fr Thanh at the Seminary.

FR MICHAEL SMITH, SJ (Spiritual Formator)

Fr Michael Smith, SJ, a Jesuit priest, born and raised in Eltham, Taranaki, has been a priest for 40 years. 
